### Scripture Corner

#### PENTECOST

At the Last Supper Jesus prepared his followers for the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. "When the Advocate comes whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth that proceeds from the Father, he will testify to me" (John 15:26) "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, that the Father will send in my name – he will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." (John 14:26)

Today's first reading (Acts 2:1-11) describes the events of that first Pentecost. Saint Luke tells of a strong driving wind and tongues of fire, "which parted and came to rest on each one of them." (Acts 2:3) Having been filled with the Holy Spirit, they were able to speak in different tongues. The people were amazed by the fact that each one of them could understand the apostles in his or her own tongue.

Christ had promised the apostles, "You will receive power when the holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judaea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) That universal mission of the Church is found at the end of each Gospel. Saint Matthew, for example, has our Lord saying, "Make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19)

In the second reading today (1 Corinthians 12 3-7.12-13) Paul speaks about the spiritual gifts that have their origin in the Holy Spirit. The Christians are encouraged to avoid pride in their own gifts, and not to disdain the gifts of others. The charisms area intended to build up the community and not for the individual's benefit.

An important point of Paul, "No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit." (1 Corinthians (12:3) The Holy Spirit gives every Christian the ability to make that act of faith. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit for all followers of Jesus begins with the sacrament of baptism. As the Gospel of Matthew informs the readers, "You are baptized (immersed) into the life of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:13)

### THE MUSINGS OF THE PASTOR

I thank you, my dear parishioners, for your heartfelt condolences to my family and me on the death of my mother, Catherine Dillon Bullen. Yesterday there was a lovely Funeral Mass here. Many friends and relatives who live in the area attended the funeral Mass. Next weekend there will be another Mass followed by her interment beside my father in Calvary Cemetery in Butler, PA. We are grateful for the prayers of so many for the happy repose of her soul and for us who remain in our bereavement. May she rest in peace!

Today we celebrate Pentecost, which is traditionally celebrated as the "birthday of the church." On this great feast of Pentecost we might spend some time thinking about the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. I am going to talk about the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit listed in Isaiah 11:2-3 in a description of the savior: wisdom, understanding, counsel (right judgment), fortitude (courage), knowledge, piety (reverence), fear of the Lord (wonder and awe). In his excellent little pamphlet "Welcome the Spirit Gifts," Peter Herbeck talks about four broad categories of various spiritual gifts (charisms) in the New Testament as manifestations of the Spirit given to individuals or groups to build up the Church and empower individuals or groups for mission. The four broad categories are: 1) Speaking Gifts, 2) Sign or Power Gifts, 3) Service Gifts, and 4) Leadership Gifts. I will discuss these in greater detail in a future column.

For now, though, I want to talk about the fruits of the Spirit. In her book *The Confirmed Catholic's Companion: A Guide to Abundant Living* (Chicago, Illinois: Acta Publications, 2005), Sr. Kathleen Glavich, SND, reminds us that the Church teaches that the fruits of the Holy Spirit are "perfections" that the Holy Spirit forms in us as first fruits of eternal glory. Each fruit is a form of love. Sr. Glavich provides a very helpful way to remember the fruits of the Holy Spirit:

*Charity = love*

*Faithfulness = love proving constant*

*Joy = love smiling*

*Modesty = love triumphing over selfish inclinations*

*Kindness = love showing itself sensitive to others' feelings*

*Goodness = love making allowances and sacrifices for others*

*Peace = love resting*

*Patience = love waiting*

*Continence = love exercising self-control*

*Chastity = love respecting the gift of sex*

*Long suffering = love enduring*

*Mildness = love yielding*

On this day of Pentecost let us pray: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the first of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth. R/. Amen

## **BUILD UP OUR CHURCH**

### *Founding Parishioners Reflect on First Mass, Early Days at St. Francis of Assisi Parish*

Elizabeth Triau will always associate the early Masses of St. Francis of Assisi Church with the gorilla peering over peoples' shoulders as Fr. John Stack celebrated the Eucharist.

“We began in the gym at Redland Middle School,” said Mrs. Triau, a charter member of St. Francis. “There was a poster of a gorilla in the back. I have no idea why – maybe it was the school mascot.”

June 4 marks the 45<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first Mass celebrated for the newly-formed St. Francis of Assisi Church in 1972. On May 25 of that year, Archbishop Patrick Cardinal O'Boyle decreed the construction of a new parish, St. Francis of Assisi Church in Derwood. Drawing parishioners from St. Peter's in Olney, St. Martin's in Gaithersburg, and St. Patrick's and St. Mary's in Rockville, the new church was officially born on June 1, 1972.

Because the existing church building was not completed until the fall of 1975, Fr. Stack celebrated Mass with his parishioners in the middle school gym for just over three years – often, with his dog on the premises, parishioners recalled. Mrs. Triau remembers the parish's first pastor fondly, as he became good friends with her husband, Serge.

“He was a quiet man and a stickler for going by the rules of the church,” Mrs. Triau said. “We continued socializing after he retired to Leisure World.”

The new parish drew parishioners from all over Derwood and the surrounding area. Back then, the suburban area now defined by major transit corridors, residential housing and retail and businesses was mostly undeveloped farmland.

Cecelia Noga moved to Derwood from New Jersey in March of 1973 with her husband and three children. They joined the new parish a few weeks later.

“Everyone was very friendly and welcoming,” she said. “It made you feel like you were at home.”

Over 45 years, Mrs. Noga said St. Francis has been blessed with all of the priests who have led and served at the church. Besides Fr. Stack, Andre Bouchard, Donald Worch, Lee Fangmeyer, David Beaubien and presently John Dillon have led the flock at St. Francis.

Fr. Don has a special place in her heart, as “he gave you the feeling he really cared about you and made you feel welcome,” Mrs. Noga said. But she said each priest has brought something different to the church.

After 45 years as a faith community, St. Francis shines because of the willingness of parishioners to provide financial support to worthy causes, volunteer their time and offer help in areas where it's needed, said Mrs. Noga, a money counter and past Bingo and hospitality volunteer. She said she's particularly fond of the Haiti Ministry, which has a 30-year history at St. Francis of helping nurture economic development, health and education for parishioners at St. Paul Parish in Leon, Haiti.

Mrs. Triau, a retired nurse, volunteers with the Health Ministry at St. Francis, saying it keeps her busy. She primarily helps provide the monthly blood pressure checks after Masses. “We loved [St. Francis] from the very beginning,” she said.

Since the curriculum of the Religious Education Program is designed to be taught in sequence and each year builds on the content presented in previous years, families should plan for their children to participate in Religious Education classes each year.

Registration forms were mailed home to families with children currently attending RE classes. For those new to our program, and if additional forms are needed, blank forms will be available on the parish web site ([www.sfadw.org](http://www.sfadw.org)), in the Gathering Space of the Church, and in the Parish Offices. Completed forms can be returned to RE classes this week, sent in by mail, or dropped off in person at the Rectory Office (Monday-Friday, 8 am-4 pm). Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Please complete and return the registration forms as soon as possible!

### REGISTERING FOR SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Sacramental preparation for 1<sup>st</sup> Reconciliation, 1<sup>st</sup> Eucharist, Confirmation, and Christian Initiation for Children/Teens (CIC/CIT) is not grade specific and involves preparation in addition to grade level Religious Education classes. At minimum, children are expected to have participated in religious education in the year prior to preparing for a sacrament. ***Please note: students preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation will attend their grade-level Religious Education classes as well as monthly Confirmation sessions.***

Families requesting sacramental preparation for their child are asked to mark their registration form accordingly so that additional information can be provided. Please note that there is a separate materials fee for sacramental preparation programs. More details will be provided at the parent meetings next year.

The Maryland BOOST scholarship applications are now live! Please see the guidance below. Please forward the receipt of your application to Mrs. Donnelly in the school office.

You will need the following items to apply:

- 1) proof of pursuit of enrollment (i.e. re-enrollment confirmation, completed application, TADS proof of application)
- 2) proof of reported household income (they request 2016 tax returns, but they may also consider W2's or social service letters verifying income if the tax return is unavailable).

**Priority for Public School Students** For any new awards, "priority shall be given to students who attended public schools in the prior school year".

**Current Students Enrolled in Your School** While income eligible students already enrolled in our school may not be the first priority, we encourage those families to still apply. The remaining funds may still allow some of them to receive scholarships. Additionally, the more demand this year helps make the case that the Maryland legislature needs to continue to increase the BOOST appropriation.

**Award Amounts** Current BOOST students that remain eligible and re-apply will receive the **same award amounts as last year**. There is no confirmation of award amounts for new awardees.
